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Q2 2026 Results Highlights

Generated Positive Year-Over-Year Operating Leverage

- Revenues⁽³⁾ increased 9.0% while expenses⁽⁴⁾ grew 5.7% from the second quarter of 2025
- Net interest margin⁽¹⁾ increased 14 bps from the second quarter of 2025
- Noninterest income ⁽³⁾ increased 5.8% from the second quarter of 2025

Well Positioned Balance Sheet

- Diversified portfolios with a balance of commercial and consumer loans and deposits
- Period end total loans increased \$276.0 million, or 2.4%, with all business lines experiencing growth in the second quarter of 2026
- Loans to deposits ratio was 87.7% at June 30, 2026, providing considerable balance sheet optionality

Capital Strength

- Announced third-quarter cash dividend of \$0.40 per share, an 8.1% increase over the prior year third quarter
- Stockholders' equity grew \$47.7 million, or 2.5%, from December 31, 2025
- Total risk-based capital of 14.18%
- Tangible equity to assets of 9.16%⁽¹⁾ and tangible book value per share of \$27.71⁽¹⁾

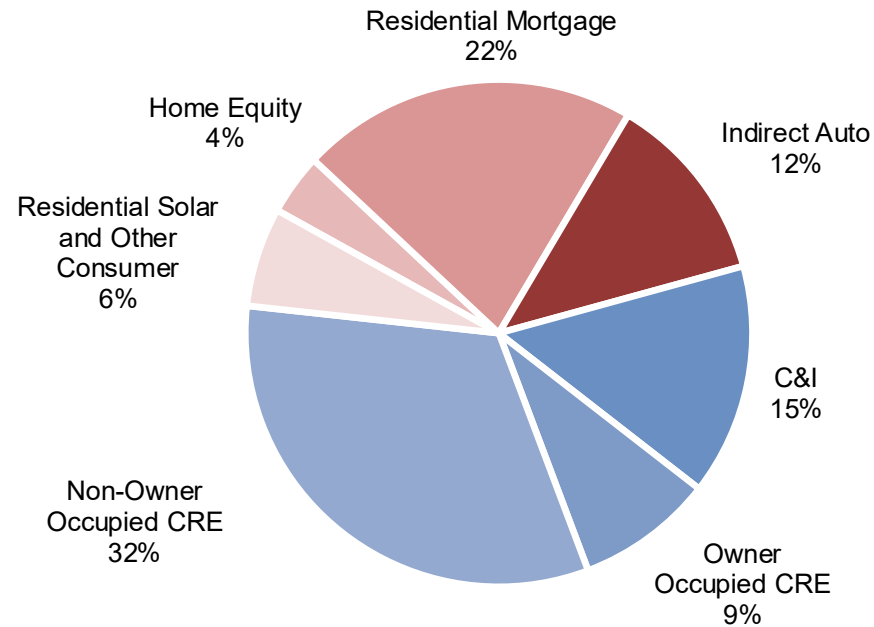

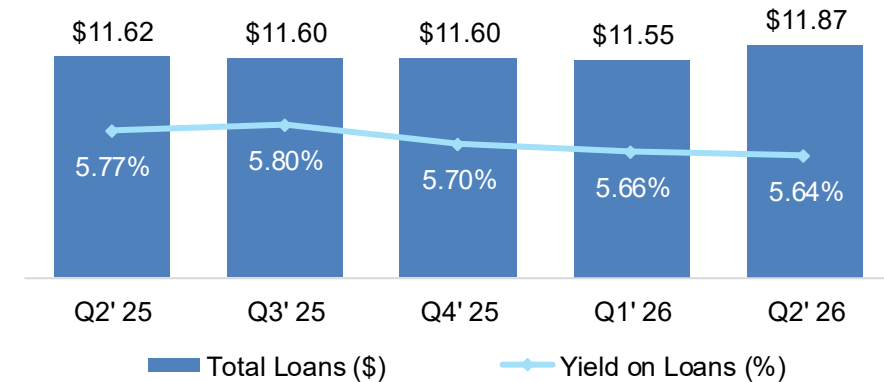

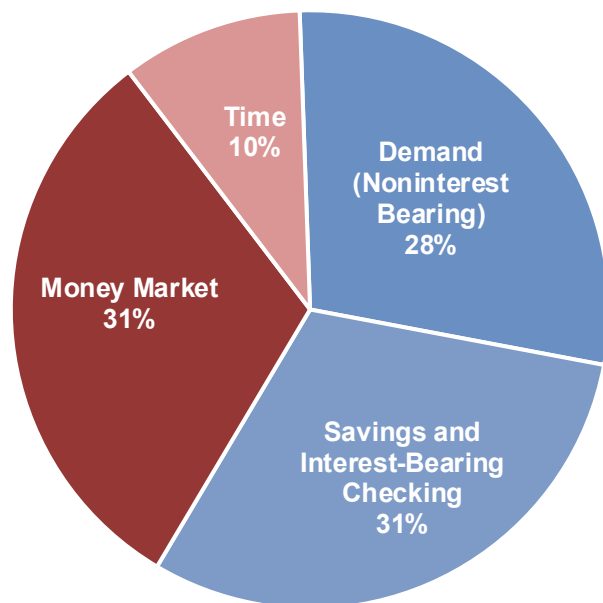
Yield on Loans (%) / Total Loans (\$ in billions)

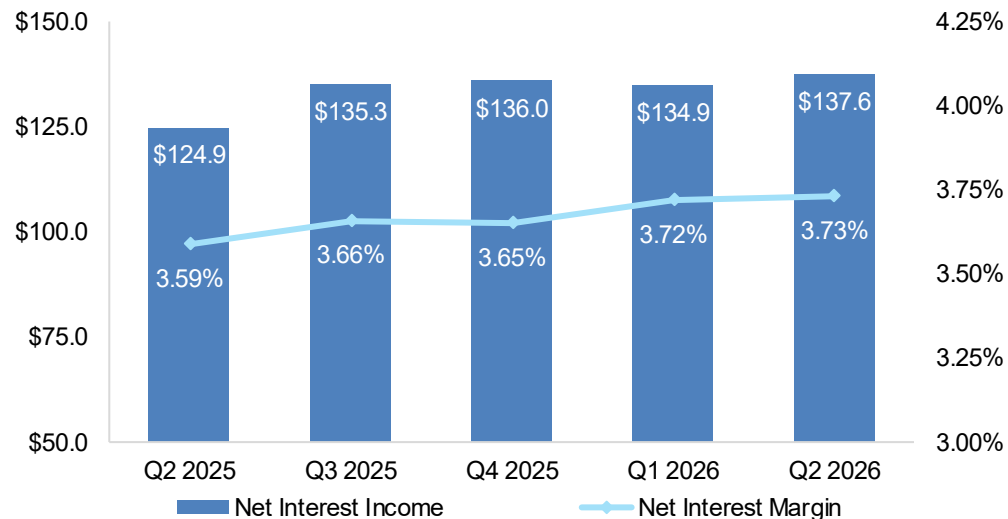

Net Interest Income & Net Interest Margin

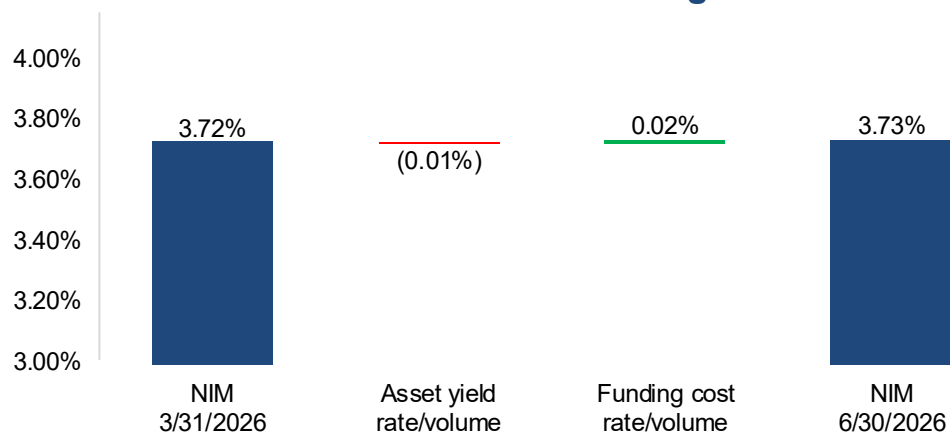
Net Interest Income (\$ in millions) & Net Interest Margin (%)



HIGHLIGHTS⁽¹⁾

- Net interest income increased \$2.7 million to \$137.6 million
 - Driven by one additional day in the second quarter of 2026
 - Lower earning asset yields partially offset by a decrease in funding costs
- Net interest margin increased 1 bp to 3.73%
 - Interest-earning asset yields decreased 1 bp with loan yields down 2 bps
 - Total cost of funds decreased 1 bp to 1.41%

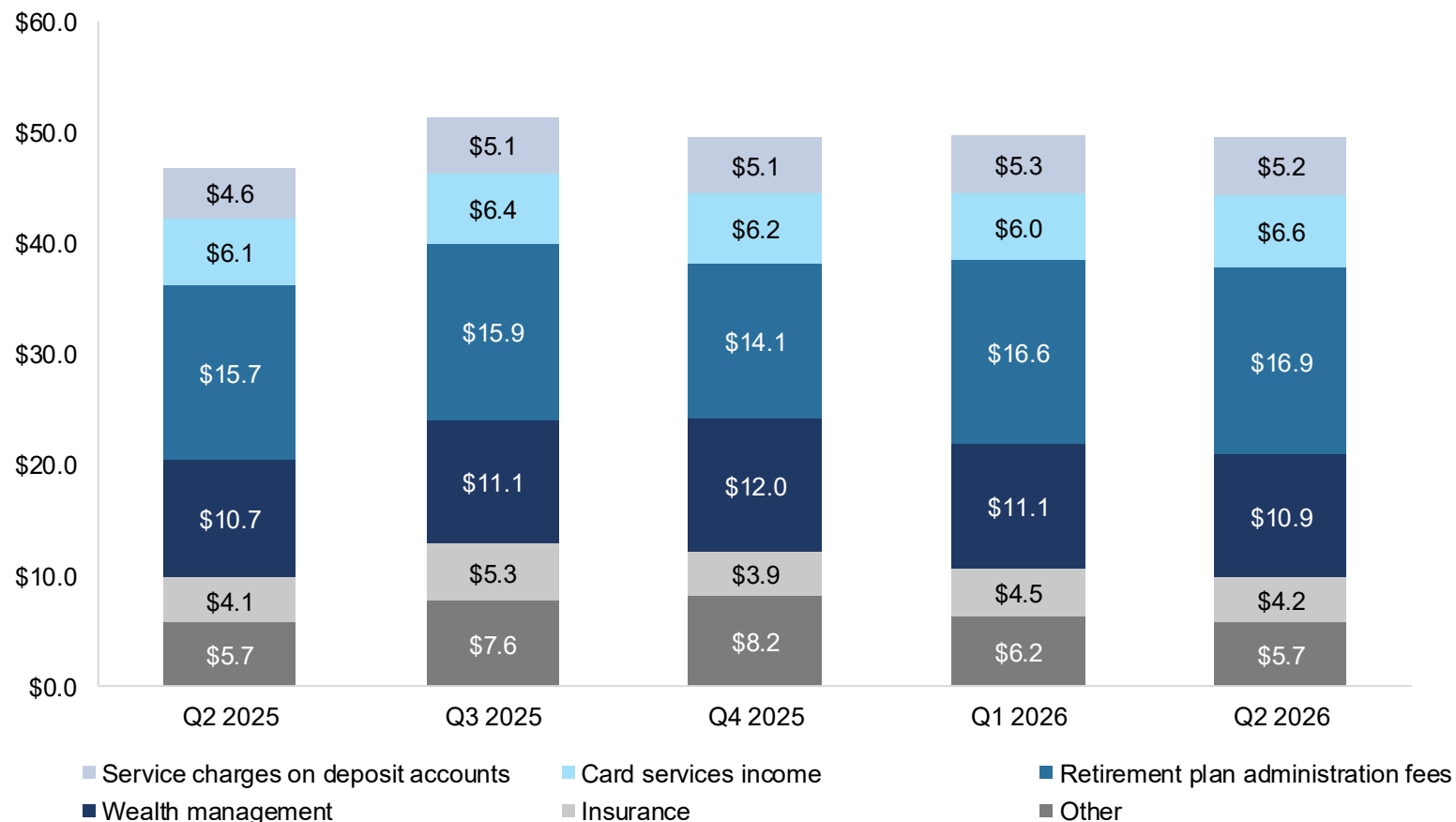
Noninterest Income

HIGHLIGHTS^{(1) (2)}

- \$49.6 million in noninterest income
- Noninterest income increased \$2.7 million or 5.8% from Q2 2025 with:
 - Retirement plan administration fees up 7.8%
 - Service charges on deposit accounts up 13.5%
 - Card services income up 8.8%
 - Wealth management fees up 2.5%
 - Insurance revenues down 2.0%
- Noninterest income to total revenue was 27% (above peer levels)

HIGHLIGHTS⁽¹⁾

Salaries & Benefits

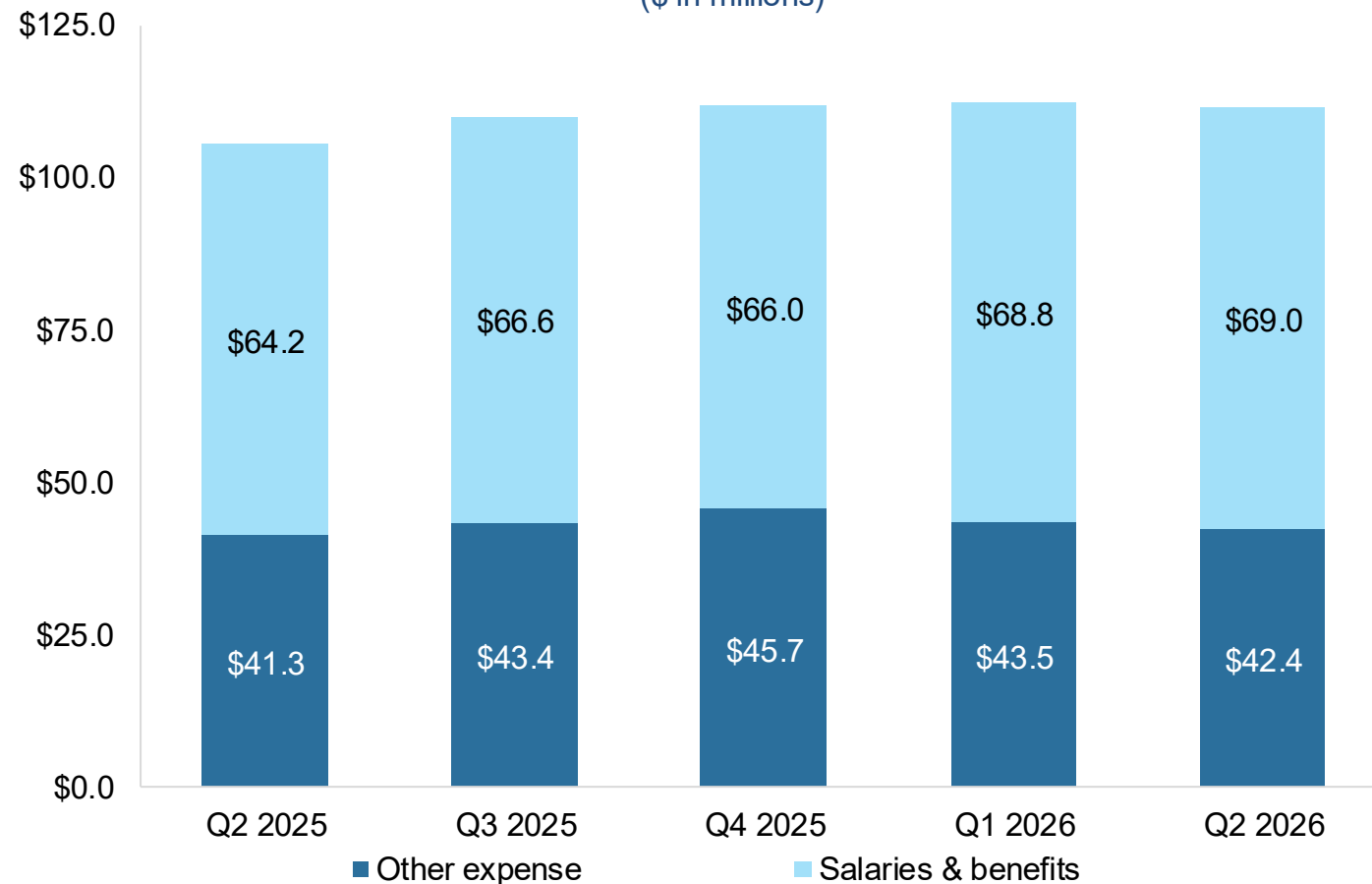
- Increased by 0.4% driven by a full quarter impact of merit pay increases, which were effective in March, one additional payroll day and higher medical, partially offset by lower payroll taxes and stock-based compensation expense, which are seasonally higher in the first quarter

Other Expenses

- Occupancy costs decreased due to lower seasonal maintenance and utilities costs following the harsh winter conditions across the footprint in the first quarter of 2026
- Other expenses decreased due to seasonally lower levels of travel, training and charitable contributions and loan-servicing related expenses

Noninterest Expense Trend⁽²⁾

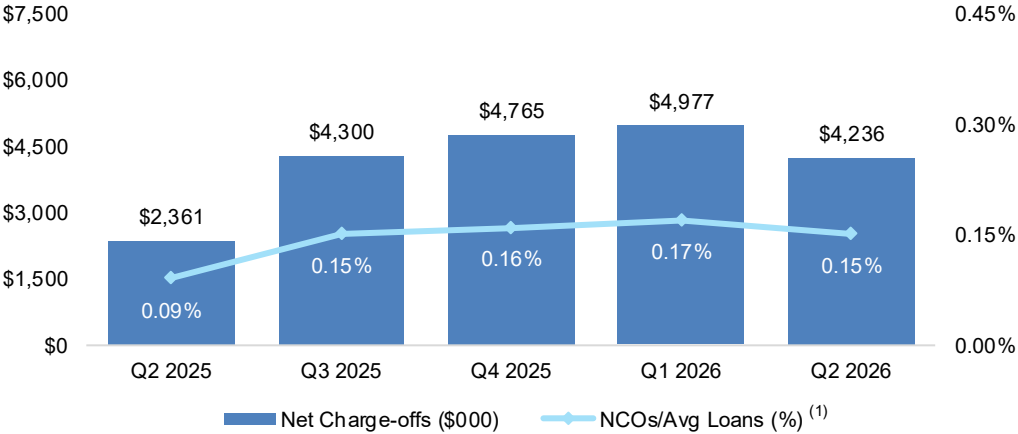

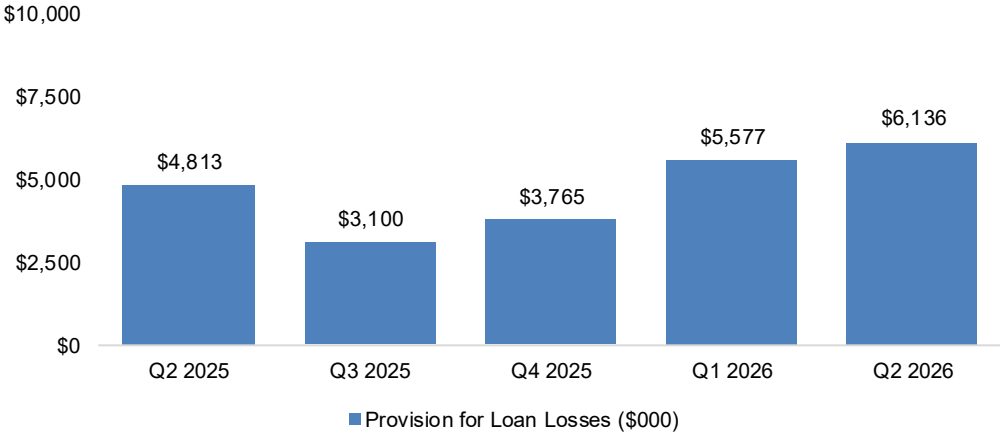

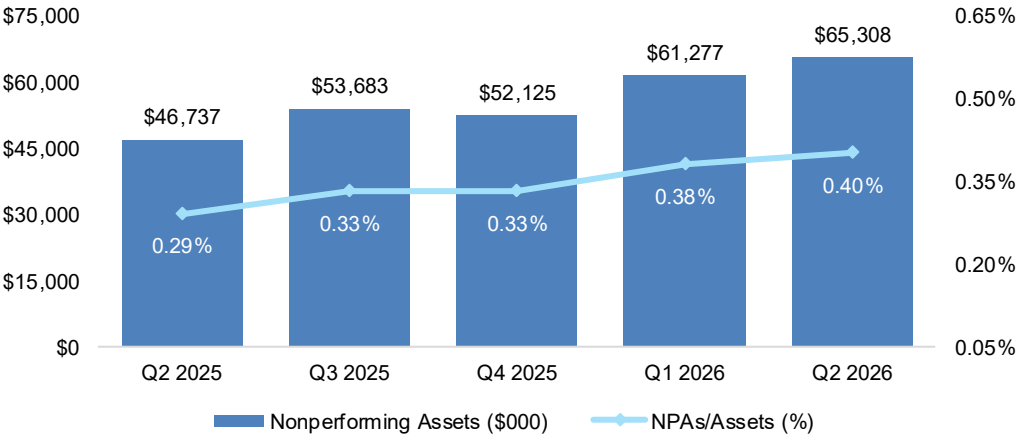
Net Charge-Offs



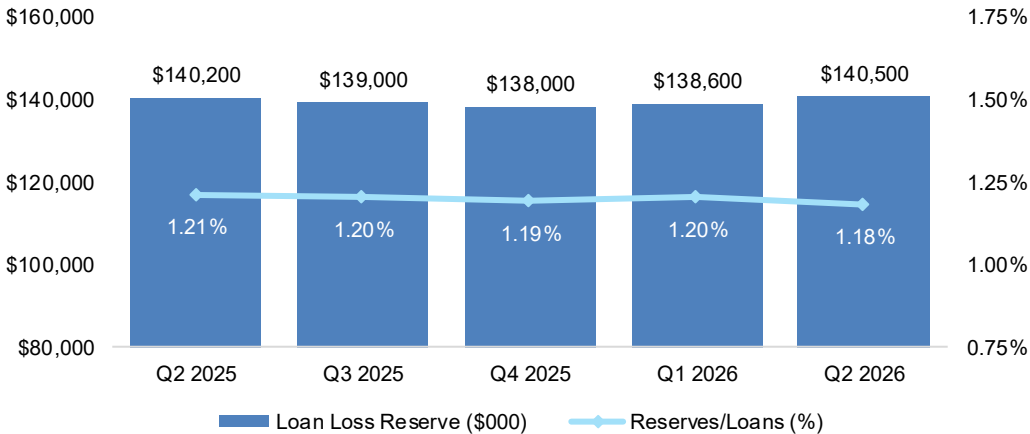
Provision for Loan Losses⁽²⁾

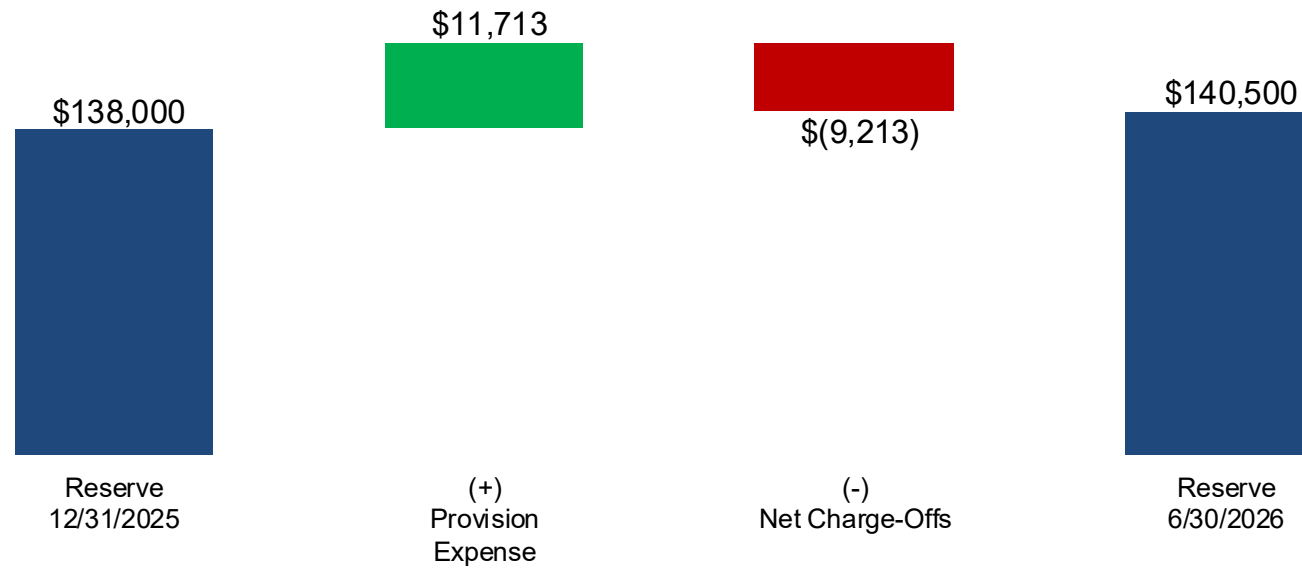

Loan Loss Reserve Activity (\$ in thousands)



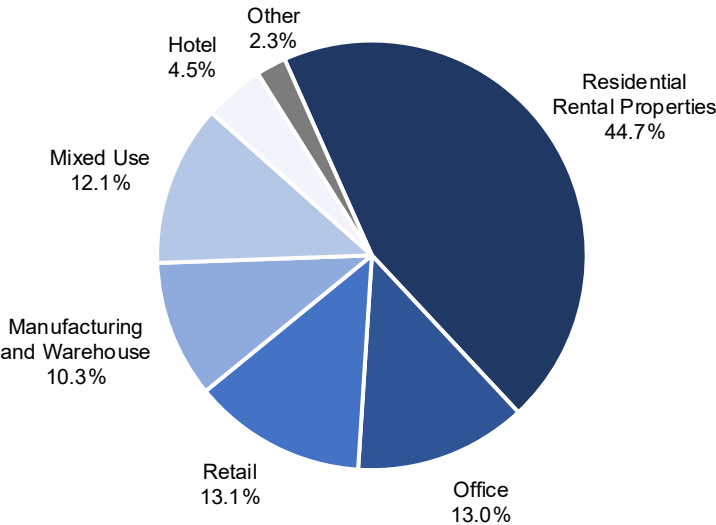

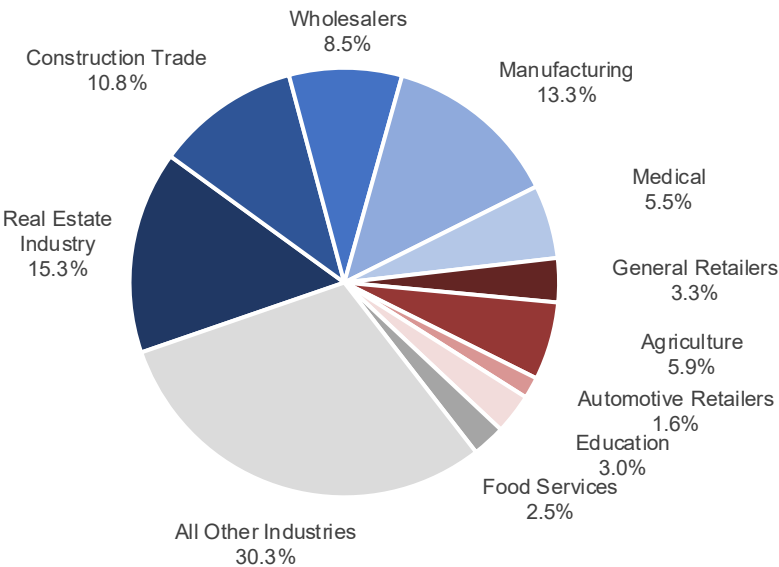

Non-Owner Occupied CRE (\$3.85 billion)

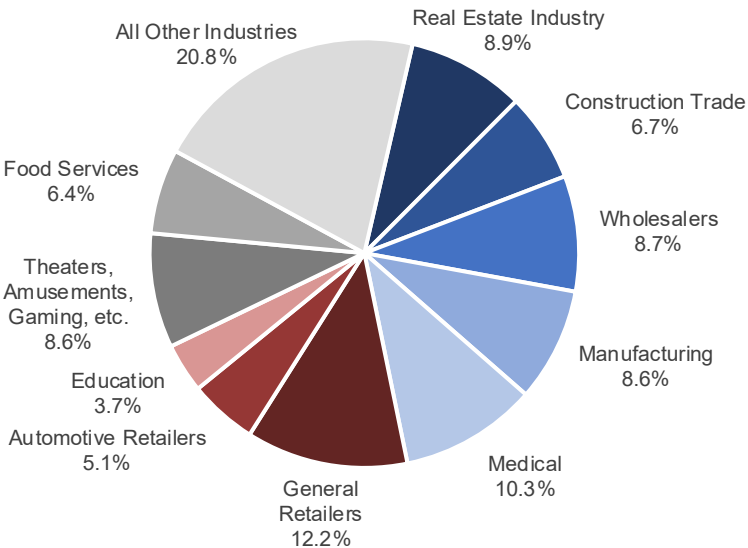
Non-Owner Occupied CRE to Capital was 215.0%



Commercial & Industrial (\$1.76 billion)



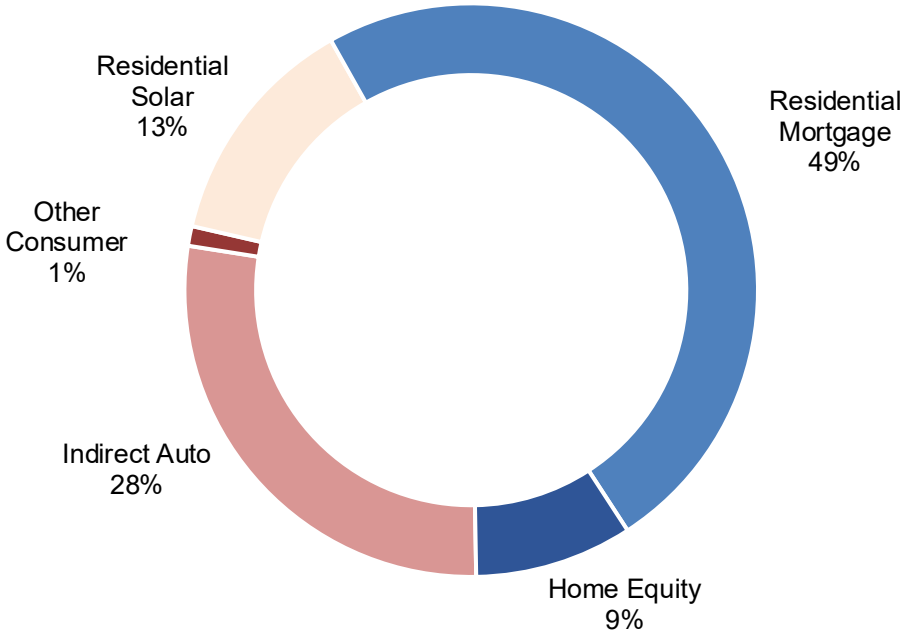
Owner Occupied CRE (\$1.04 billion)
